## FRANCOIS HOLLANDE WISHES TO THE FRENCH PEOPLE A NEW YEAR OF DARING AND WILL FOR

### OBAMA QUALIFIES 2014 OF A BREAKTHROUGH

**USPA NEWS** - The vows to the French by their President, Francois Hollande was to follow, Wednesday, December 31, from 8 pm on TF1, France 2, France 3 and M6 Tv Channels. The French audience were 9.8 million viewers, according PureMédias.

A YEAR OF AUDACITY-----The TV channels made a shared audience of 3.8 million on TF1 (23.2% of PDA), 2.6 million on France 2 (15.6% of PDA), 1.8 million on France 3 (10.9 PDA%) and 1.4 million on M6 (8.4% audience.). Speaking ten minutes, recorded in the late afternoon, since the Elysée office, the Head of State has acknowledged that particular 2014 was "rude" and reported the work already done, while drawing a roadmap: he wants to make of 2015 a "Year of audacity." He added at this point : "At one condition: move forward, be bold, to refuse the status quo and dismiss the regression".

### FRANCE NEEDS AUDACITY: THE WILLINGNESS TO TAKE BOLD RISKS

This political tradition is an opportunity to send a strong message to the French, at the dawn of a new year starting, and that this year was centered around the "boldness and confidence in the future". He said. " We have every reason to trust us, he hammered even speaking of France as a "hope". Francois Hollande held a speech full of promises that 2015 must be "a year of daring action and of solidarity." His speaking is rather oriented from a human perspective rather than technical and more on the reforms economic situation concerns. (Economic growth at half mast rising unemployment, are the subjects to be avoided in this time of festivities).-----

Other aspects were discussed about the reforms that President follows through on his commitment, recalling the major projects, namely the account of hardship, the pact of responsibility, and territorial reform. He also affirms his unwavering support for the Macron law he calls "facelift for society"... OBAMACARE-----In fact, President Obama and his family just returned to the White House late this morning from their 17-day vacation to Hawaii. White House begins 2015 by praising Obamacare. In the first weekly address by the White House in 2015, Vice President Joe Biden urged Americans to enroll in healthcare under the Affordable Care Act. 2015 marks the 50th anniversary of Medicare, Medicaid, and the Older Americans Act, as well as the 80th

anniversary of Social Security. The 2015 White House Conference on Aging is an opportunity to recognize the importance of these key programs as well as to look ahead to the issues that will help shape the landscape for older Americans for the next decade.-----

IMMIGRATION-EBOLA-ISIL-----The year of 2014, ending up debating about immigration and taking big decisions: The American President said "We were strangers once, too" about Immigration action to bring millions out of the shadows.
